Dear Centurion Families,

I hope the Christmas block leave period treated you well. Hopefully you were able to use the time to continue to reconnect with your Soldier and spend some time with family, whether here in Alaska or with relatives in the Lower 48. Regardless of the location, I'm sure it was an enjoyable time.

Since returning from block leave, the company as a whole has conducted Arctic Light Individual Training (ALIT) II, which required your Soldier to spend a night out in subzero temperatures. We finished the training with a company level snowshoe movement up Birch Hill, a lap around White Bear Loop on our skis



(more affectionately known as "white rockets"), and a return movement down Birch Hill on our snowshoes. Overall the guys had a good time. It was definitely fun to get away from the company area and conduct some training that we haven't done in quite awhile. Truth be told, it was quite comical to watch some of the Soldiers on the white rockets, as it was a new experience for a few of them. Even for people with experience skiing, the vapor barrier boots combined with military issued skis take some getting used to.

We also had our first Family Readiness Group meeting at the beginning of February, which had a pretty good turnout (which is to be expected when they're mandatory for the Soldier). 


Go to www.armyfrg.org. Click on "Find an FRG".



Click on Alaska.




Find and click on "1-24 Infantry".

Fill in appropriate information and choose "continue".




You will be asked to fill in additional information to complete your registration. Once information is entered, click “Complete Registration”.

An email will be sent to the vFRG Administrator for access approval. Once that approval has been authorized, you will receive an email stating your account access has been approved.

If for any reason, more information is required, the vFRG Administrator will contact you using the information you provided during registration.

After your registration is complete, you can then log into the vFRG and you will be directed to the 1-24 Infantry Battalion homepage. If the homepage does not load automatically, click on “1-24 Infantry Battalion: in the “Go to your FRG site” drop down menu.

From this page, there is a wealth of information that can be accessed by clicking through various links, including those in the left hand menu. Some of these links will not be utilized by our Battalion.
