Sitting alongside the road in your car at -30° can turn into a survival situation!

Here in the Interior of Alaska we have to carry, in the car, tools to survive in the event we slide off the road, get a flat tire or need to wait for a tow truck. **Vehicle Survival Kits** come in many shapes, sizes and various items of equipment. The "Coffee Can Survival Kit" was developed because there was a "Need" for an inexpensive, storable and functional collection of survival items for newcomers to put in their cars quickly. Everything in this kit is readily available, inexpensive and used correctly serves to prevent injuries that may result from waiting in a car at sub-zero temperatures. Almost all of it fits in the Coffee Can for storage. This is a good starter kit that can be tailored to your needs as you gain cold weather knowledge.
