The Legion continues to perform superbly throughout southern Afghanistan as we Soldier through the sweltering months of summer. Ares Company continues to protect the busiest airfield in the world down in Kandahar. They are quickly becoming famous for their successful operations and have detained more high level targets than any other unit in the Brigade. The Barbarians are pushing their operations into new areas in Shah Joy, locations which have not seen a sustained security presence in years. The C-Nation has proven their versatility in conducting operations throughout the province with Afghan Security Forces, Route Clearance, the Corps of Engineers, and the Agriculture Development Team. 
A well deserved promotion happened this month; our Platoon Leader, Charles Timm, was promoted to Captain.

HELLHOUNDS TRAIN AFGHAN NATIONAL SECURITY FORCES

Before American presence in this part of Afghanistan, the Afghan National Army and Afghan National Police, or Afghan National Security Forces (ANSF), had a problem with the Taliban. ANSF lacked the training to be able to keep the Taliban at bay from their countless attacks against their forces and the people of Afghanistan. But the time has come for ANSF to be trained by the best trained Army in the world.

Since deploying to Afghanistan, 3rd PLT, B Co, 1-24 IN, has partnered with ANSF, but the training is a new aspect of the partnership. Training ANSF has been a challenge that 3rd PLT has accepted in order to bring them up to standard in our tactics and to give them an understanding of why we fight the way that we fight. ANSF motivation and work ethic has made for disciplined partners in arms.

HELLHOUNDS GET NEW STRYKERS AT KANDAHAR AIR FIELD

Recently, 3rd Platoon traveled to Kandahar Airfield (KAF) to receive new Strykers with increased protection. These new Strykers are equipped with a double V-shaped armored hull on the bottom that is designed to deflect blast pressure away from the crew compartment while adding a second layer of armor. These new Strykers, or Double V-Hulls (DVHs), were designed and fielded by General Dynamics in less than a year in order to meet the unique challenges of operating in Afghanistan's rugged terrain.

During downtime at KAF, the platoon enjoyed shopping on the Boardwalk, as well as eating at the many excellent dining facilities available. It was a welcomed change of pace. The trip also gave the platoon a much needed chance to restock on many supplies at the PX. Overall the trip to KAF was productive, but it was good to get back to FOB Bullard to continue its mission.
