I am assuming I should submit a revised final ASAP. If so, I plan to provide the Building Survey SOP and add a section that says that HRVs should be operating and temperatures should be maintained between 66 and 70 degrees Fahrenheit at least two days prior to the sampling event. Of course, this would require some work on your part, verifying early this week that the systems are operational and are not in need of any repairs.

Sarah, on another related note, I did speak with Brent and he will call before he comes out - probably late Monday afternoon or Tuesday morning and Janice Weiggler (sp?) will be accompanying. I told him to check in at your field office for a safety brief and I will e-mail him contact names/numbers for our sampling team. You mentioned you would be away from the site at that time. Would you have another contact that you would like me to refer them to once they arrive on site?

I took liberty to suggest to Brent that you would have hard hats, safety glasses, and safety vests that they could borrow from you while they are on site. Please let me know if that is not the case. Will they need to show up on site with steel toes?

Also the responses from our conference call seem to make it clear that the only requirement for the building HVAC/temperature condition is that it is recorded. I went back through all of the referenced plans and although I thought there was a requirement to have the HVAC at normal operating conditions but could not find any. Therefore I am requesting this plan to include a minimum time for the systems to be turned on and operational prior to doing the indoor air sampling and a min/max indoor air temperature before starting the indoor air sampling
