

Fort Wainwright USARTRAK

What is USARTRAK?

It is the **U.S. Army Garrison Alaska Recreation Tracking System**. USARTRAK has been established to facilitate public access to the Fort Wainwright Training Lands. It allows the recreational user to check in by phone, **(if they have a Recreation Access Permit.)**

As always, recreational activities are permitted in Fort Wainwright Training Areas, (providing they do not conflict with the military mission or training activities.)

The USARTRAK system is designed to keep you informed of training area closures.

In the interest of your safety, you must avoid active training areas.

How To Gain Recreational Access to Fort Wainwright Training Lands

1. Obtain a Recreation Access Permit (RAP).


This is issued at the front gate visitor's centers at Fort Wainwright and Fort Greely or at the Natural Resource Office on each post.

2. Check in by calling the USARTRAK automated phone system. This must be done before entering the training lands and you will need your RAP number to access the system. The system provides daily training closures.


When you call the USARTRAK phone line a series of prompts will allow you to: select a recreation area, choose your activity, and learn about training area closures.

Remember multiple permit numbers can be entered at the beginning for groups, and there is no check out requirement.



- Following is a sample menu of the USARTRAK phone system:**
- A) Welcome message.
 - B) Check in: Please enter your permit number; confirm number
 - C) Enter additional numbers if traveling in a group; confirm numbers
 - D) Select area:
 - 1-Fort Richardson
 - 2-Fort Wainwright
 - 3-Donnelly Training Area (formerly Fort Greely)
 - E) Choose an activity;
 - 1-Big game hunting
 - 2-Small game hunting
 - 3-Fishing
 - 4-ORV use
 - 5-Trapping
 - 6-Firewood/Christmas tree cutting
 - 7-Other (all other activities not listed or related to the above such as birding, berry picking, hiking)
 - F) Range closure message for area selected
 - G) You will be asked if you are entering the area today or tomorrow (remember, you can sign in up to 24 hours in advance)
 - H) Enter the training area you plan to enter (this will vary depending on the post selected in step D)
 - I) Enter the number of days you plan to be in that area (You must choose a number between 1 and 25)
 - J) You have now completed the automated check in. Have a great day!
