Fort Wainwright, Alaska


The annual Army Family Action Plan (AFAP) Conference is held in Fort Wainwright at the Battle Command Training Center from January 18th through 20th, 2006. Training for all delegates will be held on January 17th, 2006.

Childcare will be provided by CYS to all participants free of charge from the hours of 0800-1700. Hours of conference are from 0900-1630.

At the AFAP conference, delegates from all aspects of the local Army community identify and prioritize soldier and family issues to assist Army leadership in reshaping the Army and to find local ways to improve the community. The conference is also used to select community members to represent USARAK at the USARPAC Conference and the Department of the Army (DA) Conference.

Grass roots input to improve family programs, benefits and entitlements comes from all areas of the Army family: active, reserve, guard, retirees, DA civilians, and family members of all ages, as well as single and dual military, sole parents, and youth.
