SUBJECT: Commander's Safety Policy (Garrison Policy #11)

1. References:

2. Purpose: To set forth policies, procedures and responsibilities for executing the US Army Garrison Fort Wainwright (USAG FWA) Safety Program. The program will afford guidance to directors, leadership, and military and civilian employees to protect those who protect the force and provide a quality of life and safety commensurate with the quality of their service. Commanders/directors are unequivocally responsible to prevent accidents and damage to equipment, and to establish a compliant and proactive safety culture within their units/directorates IAW the references cited in paragraph 1 and this policy.

3. Applicability: This policy applies to all Soldiers, appropriated fund and non-appropriated fund Civilian employees, volunteers under 10 USC 1588 and AR 608-1, tenant units/activities and contractors, when appropriate, who are assigned, attached, supported or employed by USAG FWA.

4. Policy:

- a. The Commander, USAG FWA, is the USAG FWA Safety Officer. The USAG FWA Safety Program is administered by the Garrison Safety Manager.
- b. The Safety Manager is the proponent and subject matter expert for the USAG FWA Safety Program. The Safety Manager executes on behalf of the Commander to verify compliance at all levels and components of the Federal, DoD, US Army, and Installation Management Command (IMCOM) within the USAG FWA Safety Program.
- c. Commanders/directors are the Safety Officers for their commands/directorates. Collateral Duty Safety Officers (CDSOs)/NCOs/Representatives administer those safety programs.
- d. All applicable personnel are tasked to prevent accidents, conserve resources and to take action in protecting themselves, Soldiers, Civilians, Family members and all others within their influence, on-duty or off-duty, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week! The Army Risk Management process should be integrated in all on and off duty activities to identify hazards and develop controls to reduce and mitigate risks at every opportunity.

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5. Procedures and Responsibilities:

a. Commanders/directors will continue to follow negotiated agreements with the Union and seek out the most recent regulations and directives to ensure that an active and compliant safety program exists within their units/directorates for the protection of personnel and equipment. Commanders/directors may delegate program development and execution but will not delegate accountability.

b. The CDSOs/NCOs/Representatives are directly responsible to the commander/director in the development, continuation and execution of the safety program. The CDSOs will keep them informed of all components, strengths, and weaknesses, make recommendations and ensure program compliance IAW references in paragraph 1 above and command/directorate Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

6. This policy supersedes Garrison Policy #11, SAB, dated 25 Nov 14.
