SUBJECT: Operation of Bicycles (Garrison Policy #12)

1. References:

- a. USARAK 385-1, United States Army Alaska Safety Program, as amended 21 June 2007.
- b. AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program, 27 November 2013.

2. Purpose: To establish requirements for operation of bicycles on Fort Wainwright. Improper or unsafe bicycle riding is dangerous.

3. Applicability: This policy applies to all Soldiers, appropriated fund and non-appropriated fund Civilian employees, volunteers under 10 USC 1588 and AR 608-1, tenant units/activities and contractors, when appropriate, who are assigned, attached, supported or employed by USAG FWA.

4. Policy:

- a. Bicycle riders will wear protective helmets approved by the Consumer Product Safety Commission. Note: Bicycle helmets purchased prior to 27 November 2013 and certified by the American Society for Testing and Materials may also be worn.
- b. Wearing headphones, earphones, or other listening devices while bicycling on or adjacent to roadways on Fort Wainwright is prohibited.
- c. When bicycling on Fort Wainwright roadways during the hours of darkness or reduced visibility, bicycles will be equipped with operable headlights and taillights, and the bicyclist will wear a reflective upper outer garment.
- d. Bicyclists will comply with all state traffic laws with operating on Fort Wainwright.
- e. Riding on handlebars, carrying racks, and center bars is prohibited.
- f. Small children and infants will only be carried in a passenger seat approved and designed for their size and weight.

5. This policy supersedes Garrison Policy #12, SAB, dated 7 Apr 14.
